

## HAVE TO / DON'T HAVE TO

## ¡PRESTÁ ATENCIÓN!



- Usamos HAVE TO + infinitive para expresar una obligación (algo que tenemos que hacer siguiendo una regla):  
*You have to wear uniform in class.*
- Usamos DON'T HAVE TO + infinitive para expresar falta de obligación (algo que no es necesario hacer):  
*He doesn't have to wear a suit at the office.*

I/You/We/They	<i>have to</i>	<i>wear</i>	uniform
He/She/It	<i>has to</i>		in class
DON'T HAVE TO			
SUBJECT	DON'T HAVE TO	VERB INF.	REST
I/You/We/They	<i>don't have to</i>	<i>wear</i>	uniform
He/She/It	<i>doesn't have to</i>		in class

MUST / MUSTN'T

## ¡PRESTÁ ATENCIÓN!




- Usamos **MUST + infinitive** para expresar una obligación (algo que debemos hacer siguiendo una regla):  
*You must wear a seatbelt when you drive.* (=el obligatorio usar cinto de seguridad al conducir)
- Usamos **MUSTN'T + infinitive** para expresar prohibición (algo que no está permitido):  
*You mustn't take pictures in the museum.* (=está prohibido tomar fotos en el museo)

MUST			
SUBJECT	MUST	VERB INF.	REST
I/You/We/They/ He/She/It	<b>must</b>	<b>wear</b>	uniform in class.
MUSTN'T			
SUBJECT	MUSTN'T	VERB INF.	REST
I/You/We/They/ He/She/It	<b>mustn't</b>	<b>talk</b>	during the exam.
QUESTIONS			
<b>Must I/you/he/she/it /we/they wear uniform in class?</b>			
short answers			
affirmative	negative		
Yes, I/you/he/she /it/we/they <b>must</b> .	No, I/you/he/she/it /we/they <b>mustn't</b> .
