1: Look at the words in the sentences. What are they in Swedish?

a boy = en pojke

boys = pojkar

the boy = pojken

the boys = pojkarna

balloon (n) Everybody in the park looked up at the hot air balloon.

band (n) I play guitar with a band every Saturday night.

bench (n) We sat on a bench in the park.

camera (n) Tom has a nice camera.

carnival (n) The carnival in Rio is held in February.

costume (n) He wore a pirate costume for Halloween.

crowd (n) There is a crowd of people on the street.

drum (n) I've always wanted to learn to play the drums.

feather (n) The bird was covered with white feathers.

float (n)  A carnival float is a decorated platform, either built on a vehicle like a truck or towed behind one.

map (n) Tina couldn't find her hometown on the map.

pocket (n) He searched his pockets for the key.

procession (n) A procession is a group of people who are walking, riding, or driving in a line as part of a public event.

sergeant (n) In the British police force, a sergeant is an officer with a low rank.

shout (v) Please don't shout at me when you are angry!

surprised (adj) You seemed surprised when she said "happy birthday" to you!

T-shirt (n) I love my yellow T-shirt. I always wear it on Mondays.

tourist (n) There are many tourists visiting the carnival in Rio every year.

wave (v) "Hello", she shouted, and waved her hand. "Can you see me?"

wife (n) I have a wife and two children.
