

INTERROGATIVE STRUCTURES

Chernobyl

a) Study the structures:

AFFIRMATIVE: S + V

Subject + (Aux) + (adverb) + Verb

His sister lives in York.
They are tall.
They are having tea.
Michael is always making noise.

INTERROGATIVE: Aux + S
(yes/no question)

Aux + Subject + (adverb) + (Verb)

Does his sister live in York?
Are they tall?
Are they having tea?
Is Michael always making noise?

Wh- question: **Wh-word + Aux + S + V**

Wh-word + Aux + Subject + (adverb) + Verb

His sister lives in York.

Where does his sister live?

They are tall.

What are they like?

They are having tea.

What are they having?

Michael is always making noise.

What is Michael always making?

b) Study these examples:

S + BE:

That is his brother.

Is that his brother?

Who is that?

Present simple (S + V):

They work for eight hours a day.

Do they work for eight hours a day?

How many hours a day **do** they work?

Present simple 3rd person singular (S + V):
His sister studies at the university.
Does his sister study at the university?
Where **does** his sister study?

Past simple (S + V):
It rained all day.
Did it rain all day?
How long **did** it rain?

Present continuous (S + Aux + V):
The car is working very well today.
Is the car working very well today?
How is the car working today?

Wh- word = S
Fifteen people have seen the UFO.
Have fifteen people seen the UFO?
How many people have seen the UFO?
↳ Affirmative structure → S + V.

His parents gave him that watch.
Did his parents give him that watch?
Who gave him that watch?
↳ Affirmative structure – no auxiliary.
