ENGLISH GRAMMAR **ENJOY + VERB-ING** *Woodward ENGLISH*

With the verb **enjoy**, we only use:

→ **enjoy + verb-ing** ✓

✓ We **enjoy playing** cards. ✓



✓ I **enjoy reading**. ✓

✓ I **enjoy to read**. ✗

✓ He **enjoys going** to the cinema. ✓

✓ He **enjoys to go** to the cinema. ✗



After these verbs we use **verb-ing**:

love - enjoy - don't like - hate + verb-ing

- ✓ I **love reading** in bed at night.
- ✓ I **enjoy playing** video games.
- ✓ I **don't like getting** up early.
- ✓ I **hate washing** the dishes.



- ✓ I like **to sleep**. like + **infinitive**
- ✓ I like **sleeping**. like + **verb-ing**

We sometimes use **like + infinitive** to talk about habits or choices.

Like + verb-ing is more common to say you like doing something in general.

- ✓ I like **to eat** chocolate for breakfast. (my habit)
- ✓ I like **eating** chocolate. (I like doing this in general)
