Wuthering Heights	It is a story of a boy who was born in a workhouse. His mother, whose name no one knows, is found on the street and dies just after his birth. He spends the first nine years of his life in a badly run home for young orphans and then is transferred to a workhouse for adults.
Oliver twist	It is a story which is narrated through the diary of Mr. Lockwood. Lockwood has recently begun renting Thrushcross Grange, a remote house in the Yorkshire Moors of Northern England. One day, he decides to visit his new landlord, Heathcliff. Lockwood encounters several strange and unpleasant characters: Cathy, Heathcliff's beautiful but rude daughter-in-law; Hareton Earnshaw, an uncivilized yet prideful young man.
Home	is a short story by Kate Chopin that details the emotional journey of Louise Mallard after she learns that her husband has died. ... After retiring to her room alone, Louise's grief transforms into joy, as she realizes that Brently's death will free her from her repressive marriage
Story of an hour	is a short story by Anton Chekhov in which a father tries to convince his young son to quit smoking. Yevgeny Petrovitch Bykovsky is a prosecutor and the single father of a seven-year-old boy named Seryozha. Yevgeny's housekeeper informs him that she caught Seryozha smoking
1984	The story begins with the arrival of the wealthy Mr. Bingley to Longbourn. In the Bennet household, Mrs. Bennet is desperate to marry Bingley to one of her five daughters—Jane, Elizabeth, Mary, Kitty, or Lydia. When Bingley meets Jane at a ball, he seems immediately smitten with her. Yet Bingley's snobby friend Darcy is rude to Elizabeth. Through the next few social gatherings, Jane and Bingley grow closer, while Darcy, despite himself, finds himself becoming attracted to Elizabeth's beauty and intelligence.
Pride and prejudice	It is a story by George Orwell's bleakly dystopian novel about the dangers of totalitarianism, warns against a world governed by propaganda
