

- **Common Noun** - Common nouns are naming words that are common and do not define any particular person, place or thing. They are general names. For example: *boy, girl, doctor, town, city, dog, car* and so on.
- **Proper Noun** - A proper noun is a name that identifies a particular person, place or things. Proper nouns always begin with a capital letter. For example: *Maya, Nepal, London, Monday, English* and so on.

- **Collective Noun:** Collective nouns are used to name a group of people, places, animals or things. A collective noun represents a complete whole. *For example: a library of books, a team of players, a flock of sheep, a bunch of keys, , a class of pupils, an army of soldiers and so on.*
