Look at the following example and then, analyse the use of this verb Tense.



Present Perfect Tense

- We use the present perfect to talk about events that happened in the past but we don't know when.
 - a. **I've lost my phone.** (*he perdido mi teléfono*) (= I lost it. I don't know exactly when)
 - b. **He's visited Turkey and Russia.** (*él ha visitado Turquía y Rusia*) (= He visited both countries in the past. We don't know exactly when)
- We often use the present perfect when a past event has some connection to now.
 - a. **Someone has broken the chair.** (*alguien ha roto la silla*) (= Here is the chair. We can see it is broken now. We don't know when it happened.)
 - b. **Sorry! I haven't found your purse.** (*Disculpa! No he encontrado tu cartera*) (= I am still looking for it now)
- We don't use a finished time expression, like *yesterday* or *last year* with the present perfect, because it isn't important or we don't know when an event happened.
 - Correct:** I've read that book.
 - Incorrect:** I've read that book last year
- We can, however, use unfinished time expressions, for example, *ever*, *never*, *today*, *once*, *twice*. Note that **ever** and **never** go before the past participle.
 - a. **I've never worked as a waiter.**
 - b. **Have you ever sailed a boat?** 'No, I haven't.'
 - c. **He's seen that film twice.**
 - d. **You've eaten a lot of chocolate today.**
 - e. **This is the first time I've ever played chess.**
- We can use *gone* to and *been* to in present perfect sentences. They have different meanings.
 - a. **She's gone to China.** (= She went to China and she's still there now.)
 - b. **She's been to China.** (= She went to China but she isn't there now.)
