

ALTHOUGH/DESPITE

Although and despite are contrast words. However, "although" precedes a clause (a group of sentences with a subject and verb) and "despite" precedes a noun (or gerund). In this case "the hard rain" would be a "noun" even though it has the article "the" and the adjective "hard."

*Although it was raining hard, we drove on.
We drove on **despite** the hard rain.*
