★ These Adverbs of frequency go between the **subject** and the **verb**

I **always** clean my teeth

My mum **sometimes** cooks chicken

★ If there is an auxiliary verb (do, don't, can, will, can't, would ...)

The adverb of frequency goes **between** the auxiliary verb and the main verb

My brother **doesn't** **often** study

We **don't** **always** have lunch at home

IF THE MAIN VERB IS THE VERB **'TO BE'** THE FREQUENCY ADVERB GOES **AFTER**.

María **is** **sometimes** late for school

The weather **is** **never** sunny here

Long adverbs of frequency go at the end of the sentence (formed of two or more words)

I visit my grandma **once a week**

We clean the house **every Sunday**

Sophia goes to dance classes **every day**

They have a big party **every summer**

William plays football **twice a week**

★ **Sometimes, usually and normally** can go at the start of the sentence:

**Sometimes** I visit my Grandma / I **sometimes** visit my Grandma

**Usually** I get good marks in my exams / I **usually** get good marks in my exams

**Normally** we go to London on holiday / We **normally** go to London on holiday
