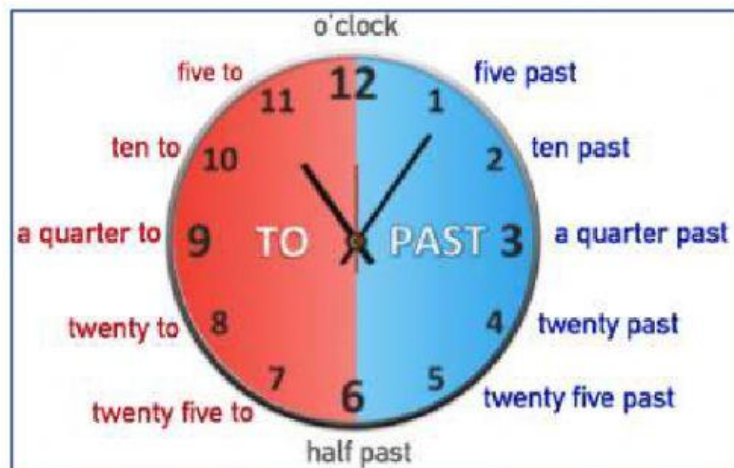


UNIT 4 – LESSON 1 – PRESENT SIMPLE

We have two ways of saying the time:



We say first the **minutes** and then the **hour**. We **obligatorily** use the expressions **past** and **to**

E.g.: 11.15: It is *a quarter past* eleven.
11.45: It is *a quarter to* twelve.

We say first the **hour** and then the **minutes**. Sometimes, we can say **past** and **to**. But, we say **O'clock**.

E.g.: 11.15: It is *eleven fifteen / a quarter past* eleven.
11.45: It is *eleven forty-five / a quarter to* twelve.

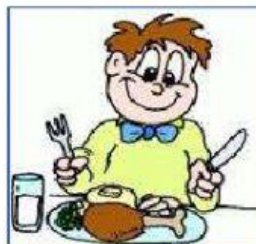
