



Most of the positions are for Amazon Web Services (AWS). Amazon is offering several job calls in Argentina. These are **28 jobs oriented to the operational sector in Buenos Aires**.

Beyond the opportunities for human resources and advertising, most are destined for positions in **Amazon Web Services (AWS)**, dedicated to business in computing.

As commented on **AWS Argentina** to *iProfesional*, the company “continues to grow rapidly to support the expansion of our current clients” in the country, “as well as the incorporation of new clients in sectors such as retail, banking and government.”

“That is why we are always looking for talents and maintaining our policies of *equal opportunity* (equal opportunities) to generate an equal and diverse work environment”, they added.

As for the positions available, there are for the following sectors: **software development; operations, systems and support engineering; sales, advertising and account management; project and program management; technicians for project, program and product management and architect of solutions**. They are also looking for a position like **territorial account manager**.

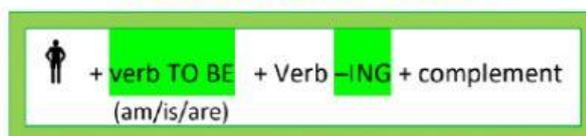
They are all jobs that are done **remotely and in full eight-hour days**. As for the **salaries**, what are they offering? **They start at 20 thousand pesos per month, while some reach 400 thousand**.

To apply, you must enter the official website of **Amazon jobs** (amazon.jobs/es), and filter searches by location, selecting “Argentina”. When you find the job you want, click on “Apply for a job today” where you have to register with Amazon and submit your resume.
