We can use questions with *be* to ask about name, age, and nationality.

"Are you Thomas?" "Yes, I am."

"Is he 12?" "No, he isn't."

"Are they Chinese?" "No, they aren't."

Who	are	they?

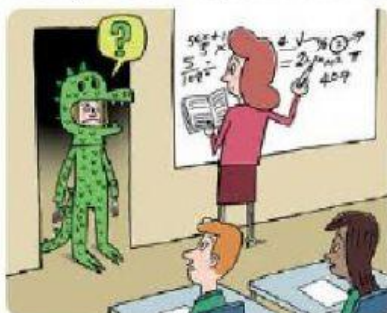
We use information questions when the answer isn't "yes" or "no."

"Where are they from?" "They're from the U.K."

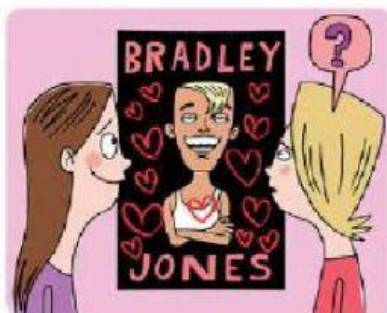
