| Condition                    | Result                            |
|------------------------------|-----------------------------------|
| <b>If-clause</b>             | <b>Main clause</b>                |
| If + <b>Past Simple</b> ,    | ... <b>would + infinitive</b> ... |
| <i>If I <b>had</b> time,</i> | <i>I <b>would read</b> books.</i> |
| <b>Comma!</b>                |                                   |

| Result                                      | Condition                    |
|---|------------------------------|
| <b>Main clause</b>                          | <b>If-clause</b>             |
| ... <b>would + infinitive</b> ...           | if + <b>Past Simple</b>      |
| <i>I <b>would read</b> books</i>            | <i>if I <b>had</b> time.</i> |
| <b>No comma!</b>                            |                              |
| <b>! I/ you/ he/ she/ it/ we/ they were</b> |                              |
