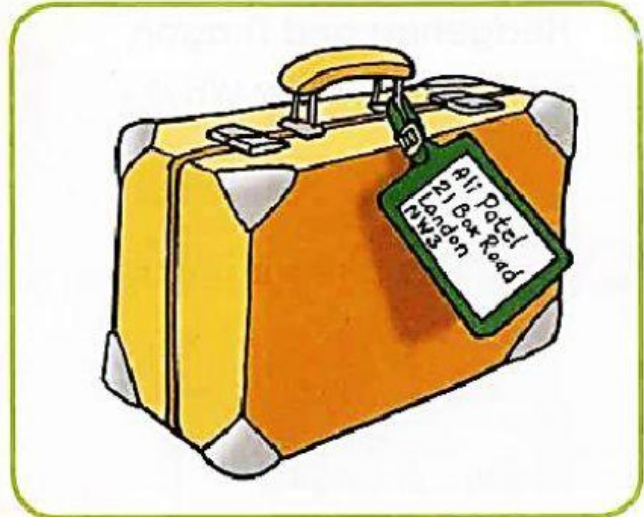
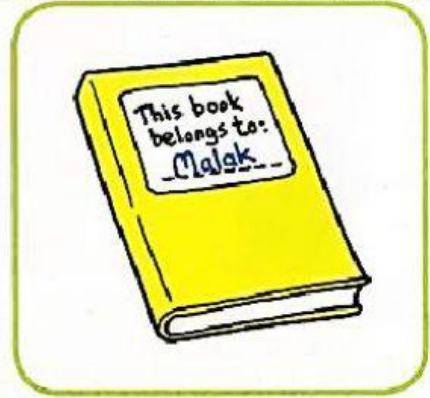

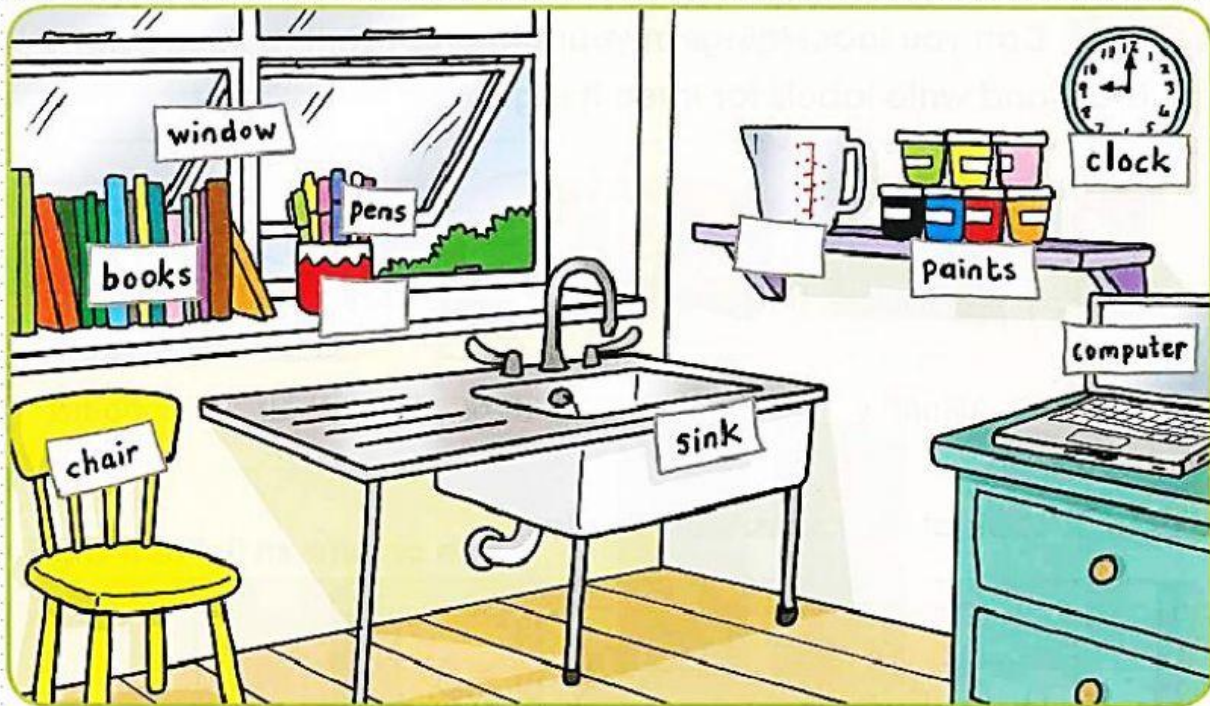
Labels tell us what something is, or who it belongs to.

The names on these labels all have a capital letter. A name begins with a capital letter, like **P**etros, **M**alak, **C**han and **A**li.



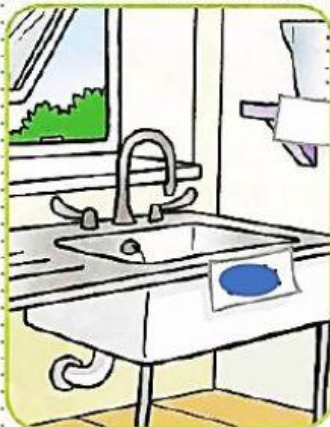
