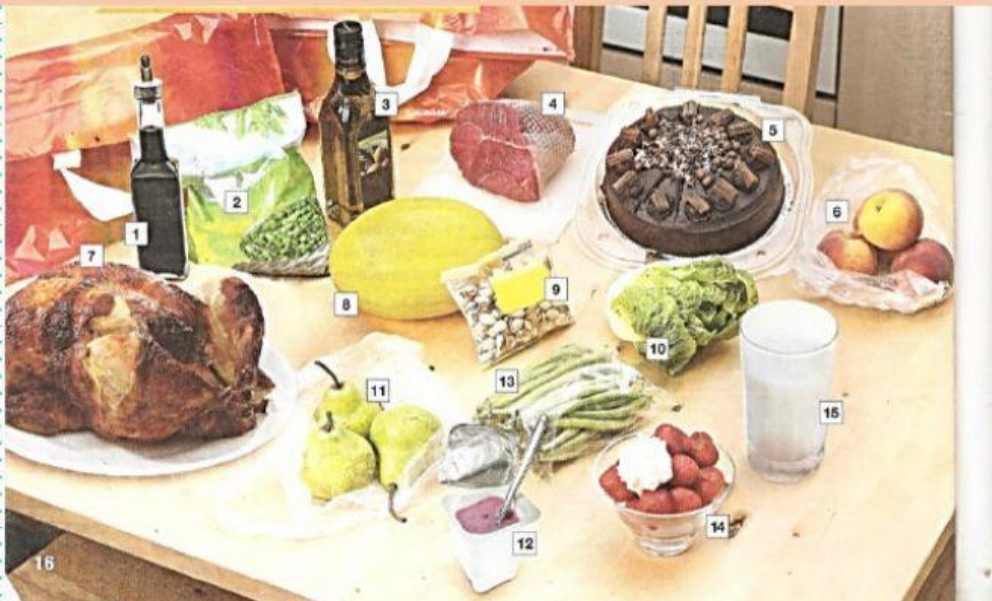

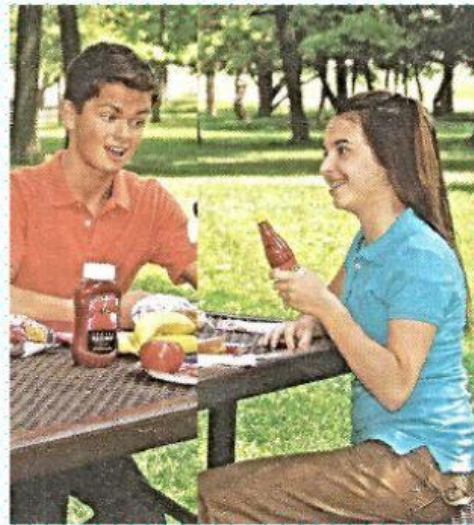

Count – plural

Affirmative

There are **some**
sandwiches.

Negative

There aren't **any**
cookies.

There are **no** cookies.

Questions

Are there **any** chips?

Noncount

There's **some** chicken.

There isn't **any** beef.

There's **no** beef.

Is there **any** meat?

Note: Noncount nouns have no plural form.
