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The first people who enjoyed chocolate were the Mayan and Aztec in Central and South America hundreds of years ago. In those days, the people did not really *eat* chocolate; they used the cocoa bean to make a chocolate drink they liked very much. Much later, they took the cocoa bean to Europe, and people there also loved the taste of chocolate. In 1824, John Cadbury opened a small shop in Birmingham. One of the products he sold was cocoa powder to make drinks. In 1831, he opened a small factory. John Cadbury believed that alcohol was an important cause of poverty in England and he wanted people to drink chocolate instead. A few years later a man called Joseph Fry invented a way to make chocolate bars, and so for the first time people had the chance to *eat* chocolate instead of only drinking it. At first, chocolate was a luxury and only the rich people could buy it. Later, when they produced more and more chocolate bars, it became cheaper.
