

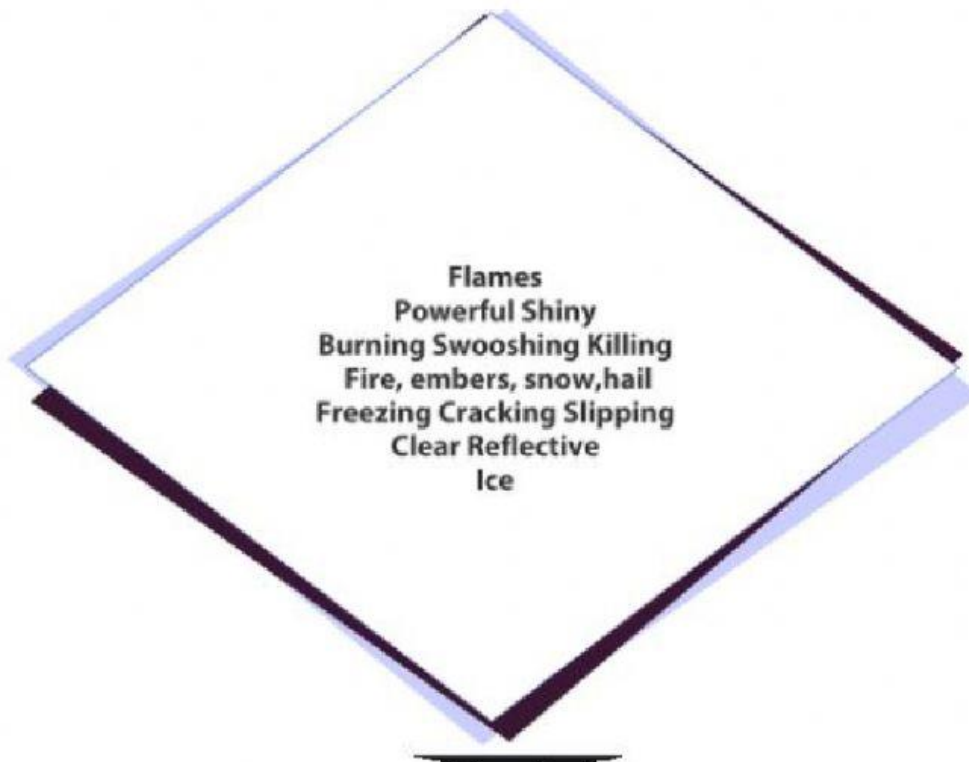
# Diamante poems

Diamante is an Italian word for diamond. Thus, a 'diamante' poem is a poem written in a diamond shape, about two opposites. It uses specific parts of speech.

Examples



strong  
furious, powerful  
booming, raging, striking  
hurricane, flood, thunderstorm, rain  
drizzling, dripping, sprinkling  
gloomy, misty

# Diamante poems

Rules:

Line 1: Noun

Line 2: Two adjectives that describe the noun in line 1

Line 3: Three descriptive verbs ending in 'ing' to describe the noun in line 1

Line 4: Four nouns (the first two must be related to the noun in line 1, and the second two must be related to the noun in line 7)

Line 5: Three descriptive verbs ending in 'ing' to describe the noun in line 7.

Line 6: Two adjectives that describe the noun in line 7

Line 7: Noun that is opposite in meaning to line one (antonym diamante) or the same in meaning (synonym diamante) as the noun in line one

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
