ADVERBIAL CLAUSE



REWRITE THE STEPS FOR INSTALLING A SMOKE ALARM USING ADVERBIAL CLAUSES.



Language Tips:



1. An adverbial clause is a clause beginning with an adverb and is used to describe the verb in the main clause.
2. Usually, the **present perfect tense** (has/have + past participle) is used to describe the action which happens first and the **simple present tense** is used to describe the action which happens next.

e.g. After you **have completed** the job, **fill** in the job log.



STEPS FOR INSTALLING A SMOKE ALARM


- 1 Select the proper smoke alarm location.
- 2 Remove the mounting bracket from the back of the alarm and attach it to the ceiling by tightening the screws.



- 3 Connect the power plug through the centre hole of the bracket.
- 4 Insert a backup battery into the battery holder and adjust the sensor.



- 5 Install the alarm onto the mounting bracket by rotating the alarm clockwise.
- 6 Test the alarm to ensure that the buzzer is operating


