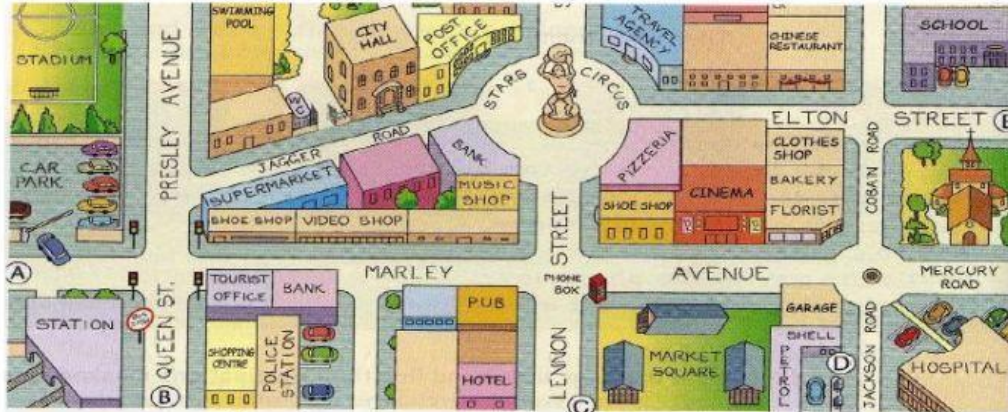


# THERE IS - THERE ARE

## Remember

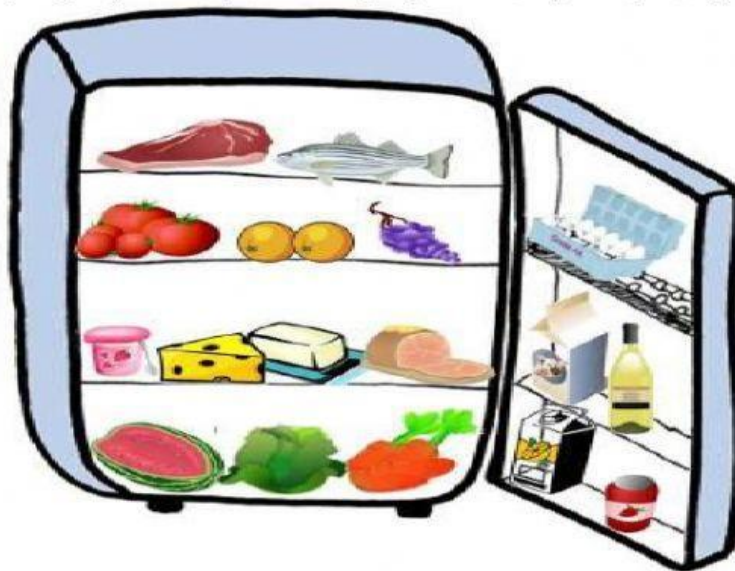
Use <b>THERE IS</b> with singular nouns	<b>There is</b> a post office. (only one item)
Use <b>THERE IS</b> with non countable nouns	<b>There is</b> some water in the fridge.
Use <b>THERE ARE</b> with plural nouns	<b>There are</b> many shops in the city (more than one item)
