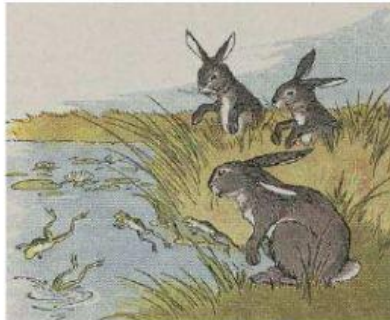


Find Nouns and Adjectives(Advanced)
