




Present Continuous Affirmative we use "be" + "ing" verb

I am walking.
She is talking.
He is laughing.
It is raining.
They are singing.
We are cooking.
You are smiling.



I am not walking.
She is not talking.
He is not laughing.
It is not raining.
They are not singing.
We are not cooking.
You are not smiling.



Am I walking?
Is she talking?
Is he laughing?
Is it raining?
Are they singing?
Are we cooking?
Are you smiling?
