

UNIT 10: FIRST CONDITIONAL

We use the first conditional to talk about likely situations / actions.

Conditional clause	Main clause (= future result)
if + present simple	will / won't + infinitive
If we run ,	we'll catch the bus.
If we don't run ,	we won't catch the bus.

The conditional clause can start or finish the sentence:
 If you **work hard**, you'll **pass** your exam. (There is a comma after the conditional clause.)
 You'll **pass** your exam if you **work hard**. (There is no comma after the main clause.)
 We can use the first conditional to talk about the future, but we use the present tense after if:
 ✓ If you **work hard**, you'll **pass** your exam.
 ✗ If you **will work hard**, you'll **pass** your exam.
