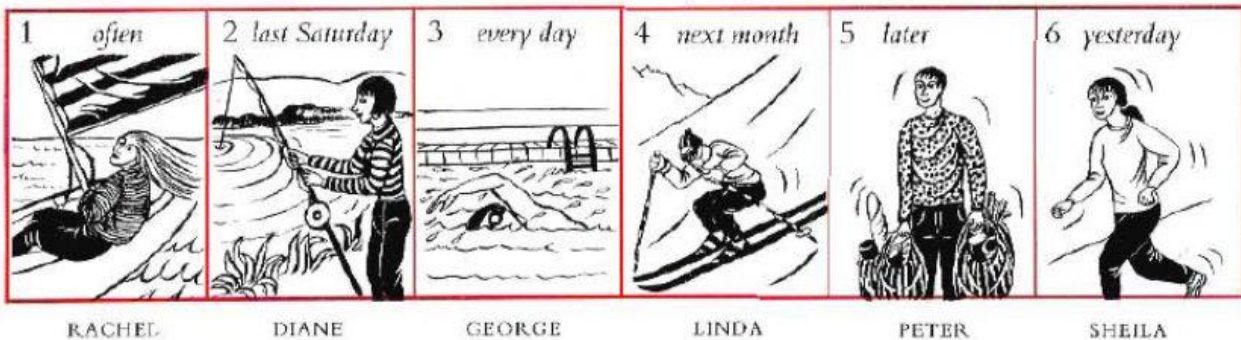


# EXERCISES
