

Past simple

→ an action that happened at a definite time in the past
Last year we bought a dog.

→ actions that happened immediately one after the other in the past

Lou took a shower, brushed his teeth and went to bed.



Past Perfect

an action that happened before another action in the past
Before we left, we had booked a hotel room.

complete past action that had visible results in the past

We felt relieved after they had arrived safely.



Past Continuous

→ an action that was in progress at a stated time in the past
Yesterday at 4 I was talking to Meg on the phone.

→ two actions that were happening at the same time
Liz was vacuuming while her sons were tidying their room.

→ an action that was in progress (longer action) when another action interrupted it
When I came in, Sue was reading.





Past Perfect Continuous

an action continuing over a period up to a specific time in the past

Pete had been working as a doctor for 25 years before he retired last year.

action of certain duration that had visible results in the past
Mark had been studying Spanish for five years before he moved to Toledo.


