

Dotted Notes

A **Dot** after a note indicates an elongation of the note by one-half of the original value of the note that the dot is attached to.

For example,

If a Half-note has a dot, this tells us that the duration is:

Half-note + Quarter-note, or 2 beats + 1 beat (half of two) = 3 total beats.

$$\text{Dotted Half-note} = \text{Half-note} + \text{Quarter-note}$$

$$\text{Half-note} + \text{Quarter-note} = \underline{\hspace{2cm}}$$

$$\text{Whole-note} + \text{Half-note} = \underline{\hspace{2cm}}$$

$$\text{Quarter-note} + \text{Dotted Half-note} = \underline{\hspace{2cm}}$$

$$\text{Whole-note} + \text{Dotted Half-note} = \underline{\hspace{2cm}}$$

$$\text{Half-note} + \text{Whole-note} = \underline{\hspace{2cm}}$$

$$\text{Quarter-note} + \text{Dotted Half-note} = \underline{\hspace{2cm}}$$

$$\text{Quarter-note} + \text{Quarter-note} = \underline{\hspace{2cm}}$$

$$\text{Half-note} + \text{Dotted Half-note} = \underline{\hspace{2cm}}$$

$$\text{Quarter-note} + \text{Quarter-note} = \underline{\hspace{2cm}}$$

$$\text{Dotted Half-note} + \text{Quarter-note} = \underline{\hspace{2cm}}$$
