

ALL, MOST – QUANTIFIERS

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ALL	ALL + noun	All plants need water. (=All plants in general.)
	ALL (OF) THE + noun	All (of) the plants in the garden died. (=These plants in particular)
	ALL OF + object pronoun	All of them were at the party.
	ALL	All in mid position We all want to the event. They were all happy.
MOST	ALL + noun	We worked + 9 day. Susan slept all morning.
	EVERYTHING EVERYBODY ALL + verb	Everything is big in the US. (NOT All is big) Everybody was there. (NOT All were there)
	MOST + noun	Most students think university should be free. (=Most students in general.)
	MOST OF THE + noun	Most of the students in my class are French. (=Those students in particular)
	MOST OF + object pronoun	Most of them are French.

BOTH, EITHER, NEITHER

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BOTH	BOTH + AND + noun	Both Jane and Margaret passed the exam.
	BOTH (OF THE) + noun	Both (of the) students passed the exam.
	BOTH OF + object pronoun	Both of them passed the exam.
	BOTH + adverb	They both passed it. They were both happy.
EITHER	EITHER + OR + noun	Either Sue or her sister has been here. You can fish from either side of the river.
	EITHER OF THE + plural noun	Either of the cars is a good purchase.
	EITHER OF + object pronoun	Choose one of the cars. Either of them is OK.
	NEITHER + NOR + noun	Neither Sue nor her sister has been here. Neither candidate is a good option.
	NEITHER OF THE + plural noun	Neither of the candidates is a good option.
	NEITHER OF + object pronoun	I like neither of them.

ANY, NO, NONE – QUANTIFIERS

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ANY	ANY (more)	I don't have any friends. Is there any milk? No, there isn't any.
	ANYTHING ANYBODY ANYWHERE	I don't have anybody to ask for help. We didn't go anywhere.
	IN NEGATIVES & QUESTIONS	You can come any weekend. Any idiot would know how to use this phone.
	NO + noun	I have no friends. We use no fertilizer.
NO	NOTHING NOBODY NOWHERE	I have nobody to help me. We went nowhere.
	NONE	"How many friends do you have?" "None." I thought I had some money but I have none.
	NONE OF THE + plural noun	None of the students is/are from France. None of them believe from France.
	NONE OF + object pronoun
