

Word Order In Statements.

Every sentence has a **subject** and a **verb**. The basic word order of a sentence is:

(Place)	(Time)	Subject	Verb	Object	Place	Time
In the kitchen,		they	eat	breakfast.		
At the YMCA	on Mondays,	we	play	handball	in the gym.	
		My friend	is swimming		in the pool	Now.
	Every Saturday,	Peter	watches	TV	at home.	

Expressions of **time** or **place** may be put at the beginning or the end of a statement. When they are at the beginning, you must use a comma.

Adverbs of frequency

Always, usually, regularly, normally, often, sometimes, occasionally, rarely, seldom, and never are adverbs of frequency.

The position of these adverbs is **before** the **main verb**

		Adverb of frequency	Verb	
I		always	get up	at 6.45.
Peter	can	usually	play	football on Sundays.
Mandy	has	often	done	lots of homework.

The **adverb** comes **after** the verb "to be"— **am, are, is, was, were**

Adverb of frequency		Verb	Adverb of frequency	
	Susan	is	sometimes	late.
	Jan and Bill	were	never	happy.
Sometimes,	Jack	is		at work.

The adverbs **often, usually, sometimes** and **occasionally** can go at the beginning or end of a sentence.
