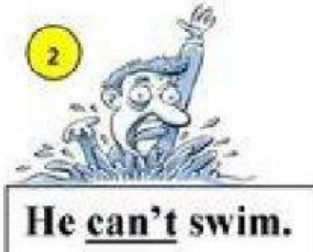


CAN VS CAN'T



We use "CAN" to talk about abilities (what people can / can't do).

Examples:

I can play the guitar.

She can play soccer

AFFIRMATIVE:

Subject + CAN + Verb

Eg: They can run very fast.

NEGATIVE:

Subject + CANNOT (can't) + Verb

Eg: He can't play the piano.

INTERROGATIVE:

CAN + Subject + Verb

Eg: Can you ride a bike?
