3 Grammar: be going to

- 1 I'm **going to** work for an NGO.
He's **going to** meet me at the airport.
- 2 I'm sure England **are going to lose** tomorrow.
It's **going to** rain tonight.

- 1 Use *be going to* + infinitive to talk about future plans or intentions.
- 2 We use *be going to* + infinitive to make a prediction when we know or can see that something is going to happen.
*It's winter there so it's **going to be** cold.*
*Look at that car! It's **going to** crash.*
