ALTHOUGH HE STUDIED, HE FAILED THE TEST.

DESPITE + NOUN/GERUND
DESPITE STUDYING, HE FAILED THE TEST.
HIS STUDIES

HE STUDIED. **HOWEVER**, HE FAILED THE TEST.

Clauses of Contrast

We use them when there are two sentences which are related.
For example "Although I have 92 years, I love working as a teacher".

Some of them are "Although, Even though, Though, In spite of, Despite".

When should we use Although, Even though and Though?

Which are the differences between them?

- They are followed by a Clause which means "subject + verb + whatever you want (optional)"
- **Although** and **Even though** can be used at the beginning of the sentence and in the middle.
- **Even though** is stronger than **Although**.

- **Though** must be used only in the middle of the sentence. Also is more informal than **Although** and **Even though**.

When should we use In spite of and Despite? Which are the differences between them?

- They are followed by a noun or gerund (bare infinitive + ing) or "the fact that" + Clause (subject + verb).
- Both mean the same but **Despite** doesn't have the prepositions "in" and "of".

Examples:

1. **Even though** I was sick, I went to the party.
2. **Although** I don't have money, I go out with friends.
3. I love cooking, **though** I don't have enough time.
4. **In spite of** being 99, she likes cooking with her son.
5. **Despite** her mobile, she talks with her family every week.
6. **In spite of the fact that** she is 92 years old, she always goes dancing.
7. **Despite the fact that** he doesn't know English, he meets with native speakers.



Despite the heavy rain, he wasn't late for work.

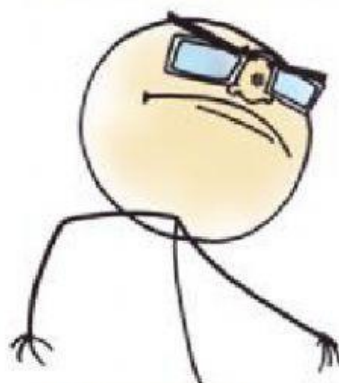


He didn't stop smoking in spite of the doctor's advice.



ALTHOUGH + CLAUSE
THOUGH + CLAUSE
EVEN THOUGH + CLAUSE

Because "although," "though," and "even though" are conjunctions, they must be followed by clauses.



They are interchangeable:

"**Although** I am in pain (clause), I will finish the race."

"**Even though** it was raining (clause), the two teams competed valiantly."

CONTRAST

However

However connects two sentences as meaning. We can express a contrast by using the adverb however with two sentences. It is always followed by a comma.



Using However

Examples

HE WAS FEELING VERY
ILL. **HOWEVER**, HE
WENT TO WORK.

SOME PEOPLE DISAGREE
WITH THIS THEORY.
HOWEVER, IT'S NEVER
BEEN PROVEN RIGHT.

THE WEATHER WAS
SUNNY; **HOWEVER**,
WE DIDN'T GO
OUTSIDE.

TOM WORKS A LOT,
BUT **HOWEVER** HE
HASN'T ANY MONEY.
