Parabolic vertical traffic calming devices intended to slow traffic speeds on low volume, low speed roads.	An area of road painted with broad white stripes, where vehicles must stop if pedestrians wish to cross.
A man who is employed to help children cross the road safely near a school by holding up a circular sign on a pole to stop the traffic.	Symbolizes not to make a horn in a specified area. This traffic symbol is used in order to avoid noises in the public zone so as to keep the measures of road safety. Mostly school or hospital areas are no horn areas
A bridge designed solely for pedestrians. Often situated to allow pedestrians to cross water or railways in areas where there are no nearby roads.	Sign that gives drivers advance warning of an upcoming school so they can slow down and know to watch for children crossing. Post Stop Ahead signs to let drivers to slow down and get ready to come to a complete stop
lights used to control the movement of traffic. They are placed at road intersections and crossings
