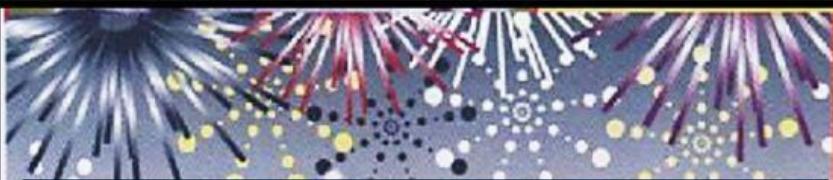
The Lunar New Year is in two months. We're going to decorate the house with beautiful painting and red lanterns.

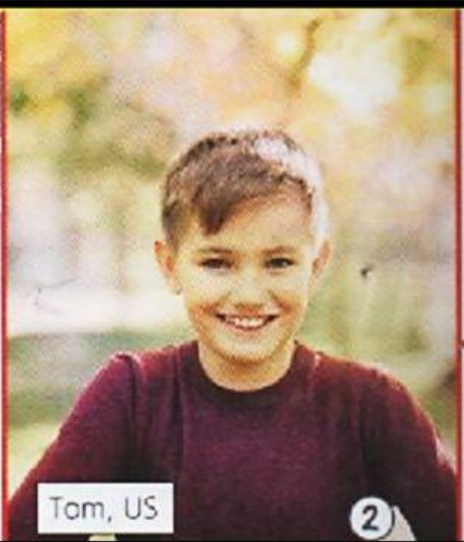
