

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Harland Sanders was born in the USA in 1890, but his childhood wasn't a happy one. His father died when he was only six so his mother needed to find a job. She went to work in a shirt factory and Harland stayed at home to look after his younger brother and sister. That was when he first learned to cook. He left home when he was twelve. He had a lot of different jobs and in 1930 he became a service station manager in Corbin, Kentucky. He started cooking meals for hungry travellers who stopped at the service station. After that, Harland moved to a 142-seat restaurant across the street where he could serve all his customers. Over the next nine years he developed the secret chicken recipe that made him famous. In the early 1950's he closed the restaurant and decided to sell his recipe to other businesses. The first Kentucky Fried Chicken Restaurant didn't open until August 1952 - by 1964 there were more than 600 KFCs in North America. That year Sanders sold the company for 2 million dollars, but he continued to work as KFC's public spokesman and visited restaurants all over the world. He travelled a lot every year until he died in 1980, aged 90. Six years later PepsiCo bought KFC for 840 million dollars. There are now KFC restaurants in more than 80 countries and they sell 2.5 billion chicken dinners every year – and the recipe is still a secret!
