Cigarette Butts Hurt Beaches!

You probably know that cigarette smoking makes people sick. But did you know that smoking hurts the environment? Sometimes people drop cigarette butts on the ground. Many beaches in the United States are littered with cigarette butts. When beach cleanups are held, cigarette butts are picked up more often than any other kind of trash. Cigarette butts can be dangerous. Cigarettes have hundreds of poisons in them. Scientists worry that the poisons could pollute the ocean water. Cigarette butts can also harm animals. Seabirds try to eat cigarette butts. The birds think the butts are food. The butts get stuck in the birds' stomachs and make them sick.

Every day, about 3,000 kids start smoking. The average age a kid starts smoking is 13. About 46 million adults in the United States smoke. Smoking-related illnesses kill about 500,000 people each year. Smoking one cigarette takes about seven minutes off the smoker's life.

Old Man of the Mountain



The Old Man of the Mountain was famous. People came from far away to visit him in New Hampshire. They knew that they could find him in Franconia Notch State Park. This old man was not a human being, however. He was a rock formation on a mountainside! To many people, five huge granite rocks in the White Mountains looked like the side, or profile, of a man's face. Some people called him Great Stone Face. The Old Man of the Mountain was discovered around 1805. For a very long time, Great Stone Face was one of the best-known places in New Hampshire. Then, sometime during the night of May 3, 2003, the rocks that made up the old man's face fell apart. Millions of years of rain, snow, and wind had worn away parts of the rocks. Finally, those rocks collapsed. Great Stone Face was damaged. It no longer looked like a man's profile. Many people were sad that the Old Man of the Mountain would never be the same. But visitors can look north to a different rock formation. They can see what looks like the barrel of a cannon sticking out from a fortress.

Finding Places with a Map



Maps help people understand the world. A world map shows where places are on(27)..... That map helps us see how close or far one country is from another. A road map(28) streets and highways. It helps travelers figure out how to get where they want to go. Maps use symbols. A dot may stand for a city. A swing may(29)..... a park. Maps include a key, or legend, listing those symbols. The legend tells what each symbol means. Finding places on a map is not always simple. That is why maps use numbers, letters, and lists to make the search(30).....

Here is an example. Most maps use a grid, which is like a (31)..... Along one side of the grid, small letters are spaced evenly. Along another side, numbers are spaced evenly.

Maps with a grid include a list of places. Next to the name of each place will be a letter and a number—such as “A7.” To find that place on the map, you look for “A” on the letter side of the grid, and “7” on the number side. Finally, you locate the area that lines up with both the(32)..... and the number. Nearby, you should find the place you’re looking for!
