### Some/ Any

The "rules" that follow apply also to words containing *some* and *any*.

In general, some is used in positive sentences:



There are some birds in the cage.



You have some butter around your mouth.



If you are hungry, there are some biscuits in the cupboard.



In general, any is used in negative sentences and questions:

I looked in the cupboard but I couldn't find any biscuits.



We don't need any rice.



There aren't any people in the restaurant.

Do you have any brothers or sisters?

Did you catch any fish?



Do you have any hamburgers in the cupboard?

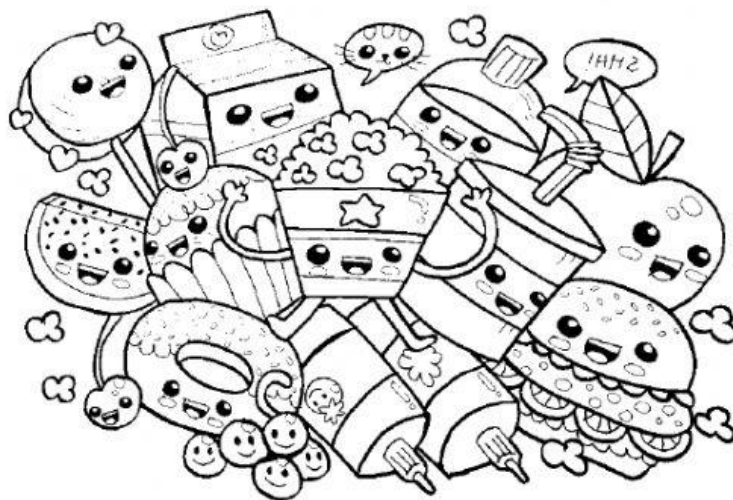
