



Blanket	material used for making clothes, etc.
Cloth	a business or organization owned by the people who work in it and who all profit from it
Cooperative	a traditional South American coat made from a single piece of cloth, with a hole in the middle for the head.
Poncho	able to provide everything you need for yourself
Self-sufficient	an article of clothing worn around the shoulders
Shawl	twist fibres of a material into thread to make cloth
Spin	a long thin line of fibre (British)
Thread	make cloth by crossing threads over and under each other
Weave	a person who weaves
Weaver	a material made from the hair of sheep and other animals
Wool	a long thin line of fibre (American)
yarn	a covering that keeps you warm in bed
