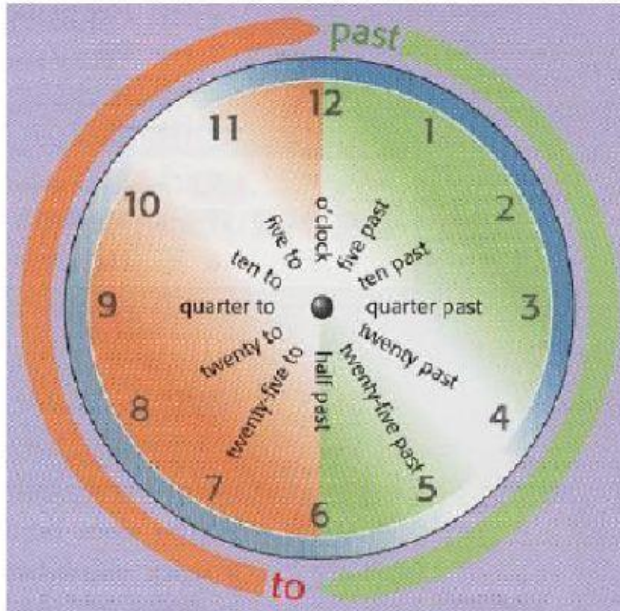


WAKE UP, GET OUT OF BED...

GRAMMAR – Telling the time

- Use **It's** + time to say what time it is.
It's six o'clock.
- You can ask *What's the time?* Or *What time is it?*
- Use **at** + time to say when you do something.
I get up at half past seven.
- You can also say the time like this
1:25 = It's one twenty-five

9:00 George goes to bed and I read him a story. Then I go to bed – I'm really tired!
