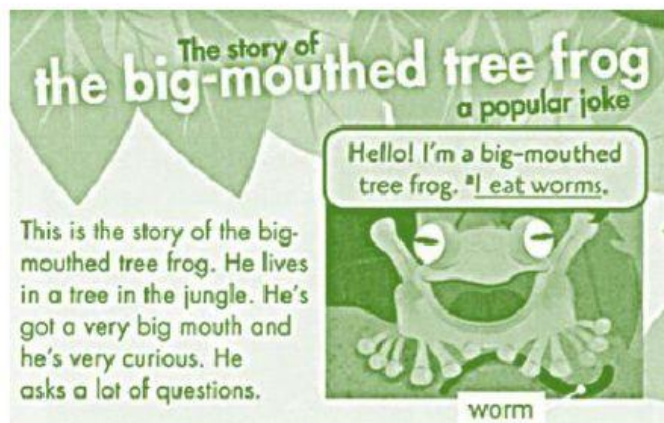
1. Look at the pictures only. Answer the questions

Not again! You know I eat grass.



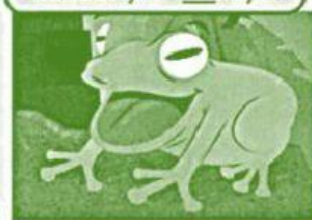
On Tuesday the big-mouthed tree frog gets up early. He sees a monkey in his tree.
