Street Entertainers

From Around the WORLD


Juan Eze is a street entertainer from Buenos Aires. "Everywhere I go, people always ask me what my trick is," he says, "but I never tell anyone the secret of my act. Nobody knows." Juan sits for up to four hours at a time without moving, but he says he doesn't get bored. What's amazing is that he looks like he's floating. "Everyone thinks I'm doing nothing, but I'm actually watching everything around me."



Marcel Debard, a fire-eater and acrobat, works on the streets of Casablanca. "I started performing about 15 years ago in a circus in Paris. Then someone asked me to help with the fire-eating act and I started to learn how to do it. Is it dangerous? Well, yes, but it's more dangerous for the audience. We have to make sure nobody gets hurt. That's why we blow the fire over the heads of the people."



Huang Jun does a puppet show on the streets of Yangzhou, China. "Puppets are popular forms of entertainment in China, for adults and kids," he explains. "In most puppet shows around the world, no one sees the person controlling the puppets. In Chinese puppet shows, everybody can see everything. It's part of the entertainment—to see how we make the puppets move."
