**** Study these tips for using collocations:**

** When you read job advertisements, you will often see words that refer to requirements for the position. Job requirements may include specific skills, personal qualities, level of education, certificates and diplomas, work experience or other areas of knowledge. The employer believes that these requirements are essential to do the job satisfactorily. Job postings also may state that some other skills, experience or certificates are 'preferred' or 'desired' – this means the employer would like the applicant to have that skill or qualification because it's useful or important but it's not an essential requirement.

Grammar:

Look at the sentence:

'I study at West Thames College. At the moment I'm taking my final exams.'

The first sentence uses the **present simple** tense. The second uses the **present continuous** tense.

We use the **present simple** to talk about our **daily habits and routines**,
for example:

- Aisha studies business at Al Ihsaa College of Excellence.
- Khalid and Ashraf work for Samsung Engineering in Jubail.
- What do you do?

We use the **present continuous** to **talk about things that are happening now**,
for example:

- Aisha's talking with a friend.
- Khalid and Ashraf are having lunch in the canteen.
- What are you doing?

The present continuous tense is formed from the present tense of the verb be and the present participle of the verb.

In English, 'now' can mean at this moment, today, this month, this year or even this century. So we can use the present continuous to say that we are doing something at this time in our lives even though we may not be doing it at this exact moment, for example:

- Aisha is studying to be an accountant.
- Khalid and Ashraf are working on a special water project for Bahrain.
- I'm reading a really good book at the moment.
- What are you working on this month?

REMEMBER

- But remember, some verbs cannot be used in a continuous tense. For example, we say:
- Aisha wants to be an accountant.
- Khalid and Ashraf know a lot about water engineering. and
- Do you understand this lesson?
