We use the present progressive to talk about an action in progress now. We also use the present progressive to talk about a future arrangement.	I'm waiting for my taxi to get here. We're meeting each other this afternoon.
We use the simple past to talk about a past state or habit. We use the past progressive to talk about an action in progress at a past moment.	I loved that TV show when I was younger! It was snowing when we were at the shops.
We use the present perfect to talk about a situation that started in the past and continues to the present moment.	She's been my teacher for three years now.
We use the second conditional to talk about hypothetical situations.	If I had a car, I'd give you a lift.
