Recycling – A Way of Life

Maggie finds ways to repair things and when they have outlived their original purpose, tries to use them as something else by turning them into practical items. Her habit of recycling things has paid off in her business of selling hydroponic products. She makes use of the carrier bags and bubble wraps that she has collected over many years, so she cuts costs for her business and saves the environment at the same time. 28 “They work great as seedling starter kits because the cover prevents evaporation of water and provides a dark environment for the rooting process to take place.” she explained.

She has always held dear to the principle of “reduce, reuse and recycle.” 29 Recyclables such as plastics, aluminium and papers are sorted out before being sent to a collection centre. She strongly believes that if each of us could remember that we are actually just borrowing the planet from our children, we will be more aware of the rubbish we leave behind for our future generations.

She encourages her colleagues to bring their own reusable containers for their takeaway lunch at work, because it is disheartening to see the rubbish bin in the office pantry filled with disposable plastic containers and polystyrene boxes. She makes an effort to be conscious consumer. 30 It is because she believes that an environmentally conscious retailer will take into consideration the amount of packaging they use and their contribution to the landfill.

31 As a child, she helped her parents to collect glass bottles to sell them for 10 cents each, and after accumulating, she used to buy ice cream and snacks. 32

Her daughter, who has a passion for art and craft, creates decorative items using disposable and single-use plastics. She likes making handicrafts and goes online for DIY crafting ideas.


