

Adding Fractions

The **numerator** is the top number of a fraction. $\frac{1}{2}$
The **denominator** is the bottom number of a fraction.

To add fractions with the same denominator, keep the denominator the same and just add the numerators together.

Example: $\frac{2}{9} + \frac{3}{9} = \frac{5}{9}$
