PREPOSITION	MEANING	SPANISH	EXAMPLE
• Above	• At or to a higher place or position than something/somebody	• Encima	• The water came <b>above</b> our knees. • We were flying <b>above</b> the clouds.
• Ago	• Used to show how far in the past something happened	• atrás	• He was here just a minute <b>ago</b> .
• Along	• From one end to or towards the other end of something	• A lo largo	• I looked <b>along</b> the shelves for the book I needed.
• Below	• At or to a lower level, position or place	• Debajo	• They live on the floor <b>below</b> .
• Beneath	• in or to a lower position than somebody/something; under somebody/something	• Bajo	• They found the body buried <b>beneath</b> a pile of leaves.
• close to	• near; not far away	• cerca de	• Stay <b>close to</b> me!
• inside	• on or to the inner part of something/somebody; within something/somebody	• dentro	• <b>Inside</b> the box was a gold watch.
• outside	• On or to a place on the outside of something	• fuera de	• You can park your car <b>outside</b> our house.
• off	• Down or away from a place or at a distance in space or time	• de, abajo o lejos en tiempo o espacio	• I fell <b>off</b> the ladder. • Scientists are still a long way <b>off</b> finding a cure.
• out	• Away from the inside of a place or thing	• fuera	• She ran <b>out</b> into the corridor.

• <b>over</b>	• In or to a position higher than but not touching somebody/something; above somebody/something	• <b>sobre</b>	• <i>There was a lamp hanging <b>over</b> the table.</i>
• <b>since</b>	• From a time in the past until a later past time, or until now	• <b>desde</b>	• <i>We've lived here <b>since</b> 2006.</i>
• <b>through</b>	• From one end or side of something/somebody to the other	• <b>a través</b>	• <i>The Charles River flows <b>through</b> Boston.</i>
• <b>throughout</b>	• In or into every part of something	• <b>a lo largo de</b>	• <i>They export their products to markets <b>throughout</b> the world.</i>
• <b>toward</b>	• In the direction of somebody/something	• <b>hacia</b>	• <i>They were heading <b>towards</b> the German border.</i>
• <b>underneath</b>	• Under or below something else, especially when it is hidden or covered by the thing on top	• <b>debajo</b>	• <i>This jacket's too big, even with a sweater <b>underneath</b>.</i>
• <b>upon</b>	• = <u>on</u> • Used to emphasize that there is a large number or amount of something	• <b>sobre</b>	• <i>The decision was based <b>upon</b> two considerations.</i> • <i>Once <b>upon</b> a time</i>
• <b>to</b>	• In the direction of something; towards something	• <b>para, hacia</b>	• <i>I walked <b>to</b> the office.</i>
• <b>of</b>	• Belonging to somebody; relating to somebody	• <b>de</b>	• A friend <b>of</b> mine
• <b>into</b>	• to a position in or inside something	• <b>dentro</b>	• <i>She dived <b>into</b> the water.</i>
