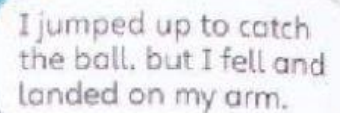

Simple past: regular verbs



Super Grammar

She played football yesterday.

Regular verbs in the simple past are verbs which end in **-ed**, such as **played**, **watched** and **visited**. They are the same for every person: **I, you, he, she, we, you, they**.
