Function

We use stative verbs such as *seem*, *know*, and *understand* to describe states. They are not usually used in progressive tenses. We use dynamic (action) verbs like *walk*, *run*, and *play* to describe actions. Some stative verbs, like *be*, *think*, and *have*, and verbs of the senses, like *see*, *smell*, *taste*, and *hear*, can also be used as dynamic verbs, though the meaning of the verb changes.
