A _____ is a house, usually in the countryside. This kind of houses usually have one and a half storeys: the top floor is much smaller than the ground floor.



A _____ is a big luxurious house with a secure big central garden and often with a swimming-pool.



A _____ is a very large detached house.



A _____ apartment is an apartment that combines living room, bedroom and kitchenette into a single room, but not the bathroom.
