

Sentence Fragment Examples and Corrections

Missing Verb	Missing Subject	Incomplete Thought
Fragment Sentence: A time of wonder and amazement.	Fragment Sentence: Shows no improvement in your efficiency.	Fragment Sentence: Because it was raining.
Revision: That was a time of wonder and amazement.	Revision: The evaluation shows no improvement in your efficiency.	Revision: We canceled the picnic because it was raining.

Remember a sentence fragment is just a part of a sentence. It's an incomplete idea that might be missing a subject, a predicate or both.

Read each sentence. If it's a complete sentence choose COMPLETE. If it's an incomplete idea, choose FRAGMENT.

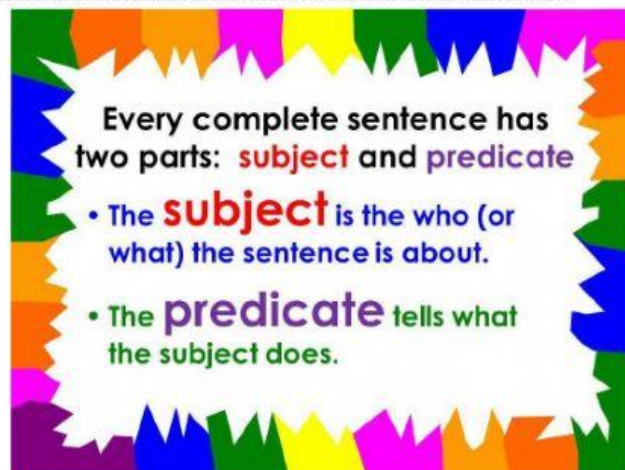

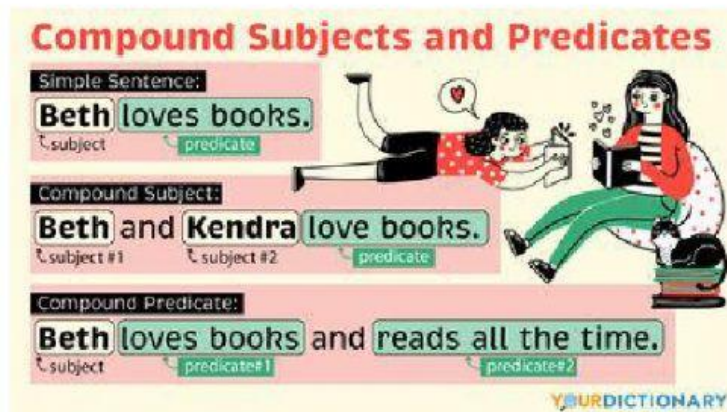
