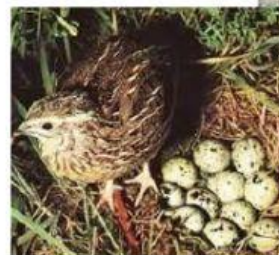
Carnivores, like lions, eat meat to survive.
