Game 1

The teacher chooses a leader and divides the class into two groups, group A and group B. The teacher writes a singular or plural noun on a piece of paper (e.g. chairs) which is given to the leader. Then the teacher invites the students to guess what he / she has written by asking the leader questions in turn. The students can ask the leader ten questions in order to find the word.

Group A S1: Is it singular or plural?

Leader: Plural.

Group B S1: Are they books?

Leader: No, they aren't.

Group A S2: Are they apples?

Leader: No, they aren't.

Group B S2: Are they chairs?

Leader: Yes, they are.

Group B is the winner.

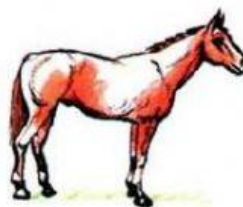
